Daniel F OBrien, former Minneapolis alderman and workhouse superintendent, died Sunday in Dallas, Texas, where he had been visitin: for several weeks. He was 66

Mr. OBrien was born in Minneapolls and lived in the city att his life. Following his gradustion from De La Salle high school, he worked in a Minneapolis bank and for the lire tepastment.


HE THEN SERVED OHE term in the state legislaturs and in 1929 was elected 10 the eity council from the firit ward (now the third ward) with endorsement from the ward Famer-Labor clab.

He senved on the city councif until 1938, and was its president from 1936 to 1938. The ninth ward alderman it that time was Eric Hoyer, now mayor of Minneapolis.

public welfare hoard from 1936 to 1938.

One of the resolutions be introduced in the city council was one calling for repeal of the eity's prohibition ordinance.
ON ONE occasion a group of constituents picketed Mr . OTrien's home, claiming be wanted "a young worker to starve" The disturbance had ta be broken up by three police squads.

In 1938, the civit service kommission certified O'Bren Inr the superintendent's post at the workhoose without examinstion: on recommendaIfon of the public welfare board He was appointed, over 26 other candidates, and resipmed his council seat to take the jobs amted a furry of proiests and hearings.

His workhouse carcer was as colorful as his alderman period, with the city council periodically calling for investifations of condifions at the warkhouse.

HIS LONG-TIME fead with Mrs. Agnes Lutz Bellew. women's detention home df-i- rector, broke into the headfines occasionatly and also

Mr. O'brien retied last year, having passed the mandatory retirement age of 65 .
