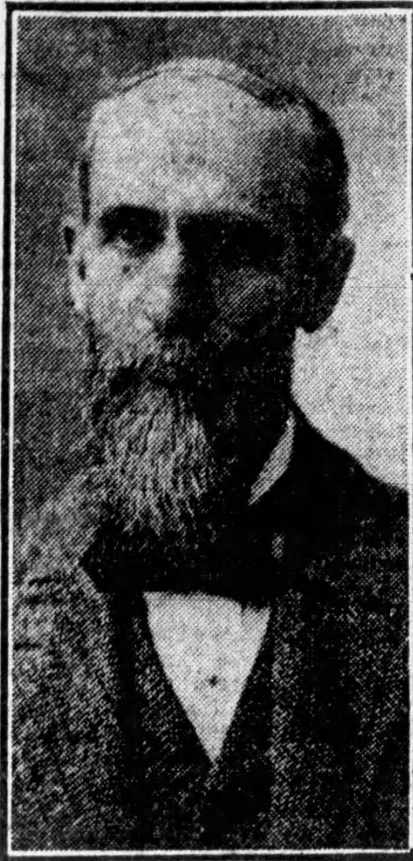


VETERAN MUSTERED OUT

Who died suddenly last night at his home
at Owatonna.

Owatonna, Minn., June 1.—Citizens were shocked last evening to hear of the sudden death of L. L. Wheelock, one of the pioneer residents. It is believed that heart failure was caused by the exposure that he experienced and the fatigue incident to the delivery of the Memorial Day address at Farmington.

Lewis L. Wheelock was born at Mannsville, N. Y., Nov. 12, 1839. At the age of 20 he was a teacher in Macedon academy, in Wayne county, New York. In 1862 he enlisted as a private in the One Hundred and Sixtieth New York volunteer infantry, was mustered in as first lieutenant, promoted to captain and served actively for over three years. He came to Owatonna in 1867. He has been city attorney, judge of probate and postmaster. In 1876 he was elected to the state senate. In 1887 he was chosen department commander of the Grand Army. He is survived by his wife and four children.
