F. A. DUXBURY, FORMER STATE SENATOR, DIES

Lawyer Was First Chairman of Minnesota Industrial Commission

Former State Senator F. A. Duxbury, 70 years old, 1125 Lincoln avenue, St. Paul, died today in St. Luke's hospital, St. Paul, after an illness of nearly a year. Mr. Duxbury was the first chairman of the Minnesota industrial commission, created in 1921.

Born in Harmony township, Fillmore county, Mr. Duxbury graduated from the Preston, Minn., high school and taught school in Fillmore county for 10 years, meanwhile studying law. He was admitted to the bar in 1895 and from 1911 to 1917 served in the state senate.

He was chairman of the industrial commission from 1921 to May 1. 1931. Since then he had practiced law with the St. Paul firm of Orr, Stark, Kidder and Freeman. His first wife, Susan Adams Duxbury, died in 1921. He had two sons by her, Leland F. Duxbury, Minneapolis attorney, and Lloyd Duxbury, Caledonia attorney, both of whom survive.

In 1925, he married again and is survived by his widow and three more children of this marriage, Francis Adelbert Duxbury, Jr., John and Jane Duxbury. He will be buried Wednesday or Thursday at Caledonia.
