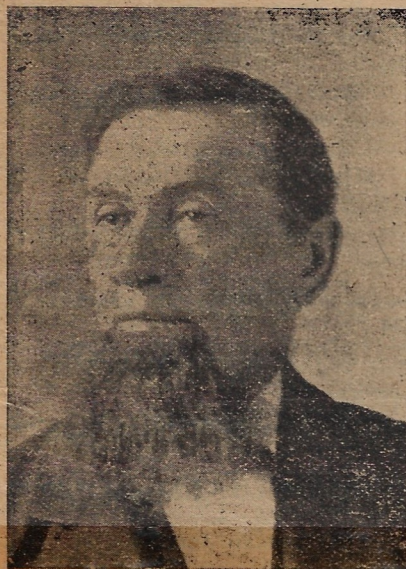


Death of Hon. Charles Eigenbrodt.

One of our most respected citizens, Charles Eigenbrodt, died at his home on Seventh street at about 3 o'clock Wednesday afternoon. He had not been in robust health, but his condition had not been serious till within about a week. Death resulted from a complication of diseases and occurred suddenly.



Mr. Eigenbrodt was born in Germany in 1839. His age was 68 years, 5 months and 15 days. He came to this country in 1853, at the age of 14, settling first in New Trier, and coming to Richland, Rice county, in 1858. He held a prominent position in the affairs of the town, having been a member of the town board seven years. In 1893 he was elected to the Minnesota house of representatives and served one term. About seven years ago he gave up farming and removed to Faribault, where he resided till his death.

Mr. Eigenbrodt was married twice. His first marriage was in 1865, to Miss Emilie Drehmel, who died in 1869, leaving one daughter. In 1870 he married Miss Marguerite von Wald, by whom he had seven children. He is survived by his wife and five children, viz: Edward, Mrs. Frank Schreiber and Mrs. A. Wunderlich, of Richland, and Edna and Verna, who are at home. He also leaves his mother, Mrs. E. J. Heilscher, of this city; five brothers, viz: Henry, John and William, of Richland, George and Herman, of Faribault; and three sisters, Mrs. Wm. Hildebrand, Mrs. C. Mundt, of Kenyon, and Miss Fredericka Eigenbrodt, of Rochester; also three grand children.

Mr. Eigenbrodt was quiet in deportment but was a man of influence and greatly esteemed for integrity and worth by all who knew him. He was a member of the German Evangelical church, and had filled its highest local offices. His was a strong Christian character. He was a devoted father and a trusty friend.

The funeral was held on Sunday afternoon from the German Evangelical church and was largely attended, many being unable to obtain entrance. The floral offerings were numerous and beautiful. The sermon was by Rev. C. A. Tesch, pastor of the church. The burial took place in the Prairieville Evangelical cemetery. The bearers were Messrs. Wm. Reckward, Wm. Bartelt, P. Knopf, J. Buscho, August Fisher and J. B. Wolf.
