Death of Hon. D. M. Hanson.

The decease of this gentleman which occurred on Wednesday night, from typhoid fever, at his residence in Minneapolis, though not unexpected, causes a deep gloom throughout the community. He had been ill for several weeks.

The deceased was a lawyer of much promise and a member of the Council. During the recent session of the Legislature he was prevented for a number of weeks from attending its deliberations, in consequence of illness, but recovered sufficiently to be present during the last few days. He returned home—where he was taken with a relapse, which terminated his existence. He was a native of Maine, but had resided in Wisconsin for a few years previous to his coming to our Territory. His age was about twenty-seven years. He leaves a family to mourn his untimely decease.

The funeral will take place to-morrow at 12 o'clock, M., at which the friends of the deceased and the Masonic Fraternity are invited to attend.
