

—News reached St. Paul last evening that Dr. and State Senator W. L. Hollister, of Austin, had received a federal appointment as inspector of internal revenue, vice a Nebraska man displaced. He is said to have received the appointment through Senator Sabin's influence, and that gentleman was interrogated at Stillwater, but had nothing beyond the fact of the appointment to tell. Dr. Hollister is well known in St. Paul, particularly among the habitués of the Metropolitan, which hotel he makes his abiding place when here. He is in the forty-seventh year of his age and was born in New York, where he received a medical education and practiced his profession until 1868, when he moved to Minnesota and settled in Mower county. He has taken an active interest in politics for a number of years, and in 1882 was elected State Senator from the Third district. He was often heard from during the session of the legislature, has pleasant and affable manners and many warm friends.—*Pioneer Press*, May 17.
