Profusion of Flowers Covers J.G. Lund's Casket

Funeral Is Attended by Many Friends of the Dead Man.

Flowers in great profusion, given by loving friends, covered the casket of John G. Lund when his body was lowered to its last resting place at Crystal Lake cemetery yesterday afternoon.

The regard in which he was held was shown by the number of persons who attended the funeral. They came from all the Northwestern states, and every one paid a tribute to the memory of the man who had proved himself a friend to many as well in his social as in his business life.

The funeral services took place at his late home, 2304 Emerson avenue north, and were in charge of the Scottish Rite Masons. The eulogy at the grave was delivered by Rev. G. L. Morrill of the People's church.

TRIBUTE OF PASTOR,

He said in part:

"John G. Lund was a man. In business he was laborious. In society he was light-hearted. In politics he was loyal. In religion he was liberal. In his home he was loving. What the idea of harmony is to music, his wife was to his life. For there was no service nor sacrifice too great to be made. They did not cease to be lovers when married: and when she died he died; for after his return from the cemetery he said to me: 'I wish you had buried me by her side.' " The pallbearers were: C. M.
