

## **DR. MILLIGAN DEAD.**

### **Demise of One of the Oldest Physicians in Minnesota.**

WABASHA, Minn., Dec. 4.—Dr. F. H. Milligan, of this city, died this morning, aged fifty-eight years. About 10 o'clock last evening, while making a professional visit, he was taken with a severe cramp in the vicinity of the heart. After reaching home this seemed to pass away and no danger was feared. At 4:30 o'clock he arose from bed, walked across the floor, seated himself in a chair, and expired. Dr. Milligan came to this city in 1853, and, with the exception of four years spent in the army, has practiced his profession here ever since. He practiced medicine in Minnesota longer than any other living man, with the exception of Dr. Murphy, of St. Paul. Dr. Milligan was a life-long Democrat and held many offices. He was mayor of the city for several years, filled several county offices, and represented this district in the Minnesota house of representatives. He was the centennial president of the State Medical society. He was a prominent member of the G. A. R., and stood high in the I. O. O. F. and Knights of Honor. He was universally admired and respected. A wife and two children survive him.
