The many friends of Mr. J. P. Plummer will regret to learn of his death, which took place yesterday morning, the result of a stroke of paralysis. Deceased was an old and highly respected citizen of Minneapolis. Born in New Hampshire, he came to this State in 1853, securing a homestead in Brooklyn Township, where he lived up to 1879, when he moved to this city, which has since been his home. Mr. Plummer was a member of the first Territorial Legislature, and was at one time Clerk of the District Court of Hennepin County. Seven of his children survive him. Deceased was a generous, upright man, and his many excellent qualities had endeared him to an extended circle of friends, who sincerely mourn his death. The funeral takes place from the Franklin Avenue Methodist Church at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon.
