KILLED WITH A CLUB.

Hon. C. E. Stacy, of Farmington, Dies from Injuries Received from an Unknown Assailant.

ROCHESTER, Minn., July 22—Yesterday Hon. C. E. Stacy, of Farmington, died from injuries received last Sunday night from some unknown assailant. On that evening he started for the farm of Dr. E. C. Cross, near Chester. He was met by a man in the woods and knocked from his horse, being severely beaten. His skull was fractured, cheek-bone broken and other cuts and bruises were received. There is no trace of the assailant. Mr. Stacy lived at Farmington, where he carried on the business of contractor and builder. He was fifty-six years of age and has lived in this county over fifteen years. He was in the legislature in 1878-9, and was highly respected by all who knew him.
