The death of Hon. C. E. Stacy, who was injured last Sunday night, occurred last evening about 8 o'clock. His life was despaired of from the first, and when visited yesterday morning by Doctors Cross and Mayo, it was found that he was beginning to show signs of weakness. He came to this state in 1866, and resided upon his farm since that time, following his trade of carpenter and builder to some extent. He served two terms in the state legislature with credit to himself and to the entire satisfaction of his constituents. His untimely death will be sincerely mourned by a large circle of friends. He leaves an estimable wife and one son to mourn his loss. The accident was undoubtedly caused by his being trampled upon by the large horse which he was riding at the time.
