

## RICHARD TIGHE IS FOUND DEAD

Richard L. Tighe, 36, Wayzata, state representative for the south half of the Thirty-sixth district, was found dead today in his car at his Wayzata home.

The body was found by Oke Dyp-  
lin, caretaker seated in the front  
seat of the machine. One garage  
door was open and the car was not  
running. He was last seen about  
2 a.m.

A post mortem was scheduled  
today to determine the cause of  
death.

He was elected  
to the legisla-  
ture in 1935  
and was widely  
known in politi-  
cal circles. He  
intended to file  
for re-election  
this year. He  
was a liberal  
Democrat.



Mr. Tighe was  
born in St. Paul **R. L. Tighe**  
Jan. 13, 1902, the son of Mr. and  
Mrs. Ambrose Tighe, pioneer resi-  
dents of St. Paul. He attended

St. Paul academy, Taft school at  
Watertown, Conn., and the Uni-  
versity of Minnesota, graduating  
from the law school there.

He practiced in Minneapolis with  
the firm of Kingman, Cross, Mor-  
ley and Cant until leaving several  
years ago to take up practice in  
Wayzata.

Mr. Tighe was president of the  
Wayzata Business Men's club, and  
was a member of the Minneapolis  
club, the Hennepin County Bar as-  
sociation and Woodhill Golf club.

Survivors include the widow and  
four children, Douglas, Molly, Nora  
and Deborah.
