REP. JAMES L. ADAMS
Minneapolis' 31st district

Biggest victory for Rep. James L. Adams in his freshman session two years ago was passage of the "phone-hog" bill making it a violation of law for party-line users to refuse to relinquish a line for an emergency call.



Adams authored the measure and effectively herded it to passage.

The young Minneapolis legislator is an electrician by trade, working for Hennepin county. He is a member of the AFL electrical workers' union. *Mpls. Star*

Adams plunged into DFL political activity upon his return from World War II service. He has held posts on the DFL central committee in Hennepin county and the fifth district executive board.

He belongs to the Stenbeck Swedish lodge, the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Moose and Southside Business Men's association.
