Fudro, 38, was captain of the Edison high school baseball team that won a state championship, is former boys' director at North East Neighborhood house and has directed several girls' softball teams in commercial leagues.

He attended St. Thomas college and the University of Minnesota and was welterweight amateur boxing champion at the University. He now coaches boxing at the Margaret Barry settlement house and for some years has been active as a Golden Gloves boxing coach.

He served with the United States coast guard in World War II, picking up a Purple Heart citation along the way.

Fudro belongs to the Church of the Holy Cross, the Polish National alliance and the Corkers club, which he has served as a director since 1951. He is active in the DFL party, and was a delegate to party county, district and state conventions in 1956.
