Thorup was a municipal judge in Blaine from 1962 to 1968 and is a past president of the Minnesota Municipal Judges Association.

As a senator, Thorup was an outspoken critic of the U.S. Supreme Court's abortion decision. He sponsored a bill passed this year that appears to restrict abortions more severely than permitted by the U.S. Supreme Court. The law now is being chai-lenged in the courts.
