A MEMORIAL RECORD

George Mann was born at Heron Lake, Minnesota on March 26, 1918, the son of Charles and Carrie (Paulson) Mann. He attended the public schools in Jackson County.

His marriage to Alice Benson took place at Jeffers, Minnesota on December 22, 1939. Following their marriage, George and Alice lived on a farm near Bingham Lake, Minnesota for 5 years before moving to their present farm in Jackson County, 2 miles southwest of Windom.

For all of his adult lifetime George was active in the affairs of his community. He was a member of the First United Methodist Church of Windom and had served on that church's board. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge and the Zurah Shrihe Temple. Having run for State Legislator in 1958 he was elected and served in that capacity for 24 years. Over that time he chaired the Agriculture Committee and was presently the chairman of the Transportation Committee. A mong his numerous other contributions to his community was 23 years of service as director of the Grain Terminal Association, 25 years as a director of the Windom Elevator (President of that board from 1965 to 1979), and director of the Windom Co-op Oil Association from 1951 to 1954.

On April 29th, George suffered a heart attack at his home and was first admitted to the Windom Hospital then transferred to the University of Minnesota Hospital, Efforts to treat him were not successful and early on Monday morning, June 4, 1984, he died at the University Hospital at the age of 66 years, 2 months and 8 days of age.

George was preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his loving wife, Alice, of Windom: one brother, Dale Mann of Rapid City, South Dakota: 2 nephews, Reverend Donald Mann of Galesburg, Illinois and Duane Mann of Tempe, Arizonia: and 2 nieces, Janell McKinstry of Waynesville, Missouri and Cheryl Jones of Rapid City, South Dakota.
