He comes by it naturally as he and his brother have made themselves names in farming circles with their operations on their big farm near Arlington. They were born on the 320-acre farm homesteaded by their father and grandfather, took it over and have expanded it to nearly 700 acres, devoted largely to dairying. Mueller won two dozen athletic letters while attending Arlington high school, attended St. Olaf college and then returned to the farm. He has been a township clerk, director of the Sibley county fair board for over a dozen years and active in his Lutheran church.

He returns for his ninth consecutive term in 1957 after, for him, an unusually inactive interim stretch, which generally has seen him on various study committees.

In the 1955 session, Mueller was on the dairy products and livestock, drainage and soil conservation, employes' compensation, highways and municipal affairs committees.
