being overlooked by candidates on He also was chairman of the Local other DFL tickets and by Gov. Arne Carlson.

"Half the state's population lives in rural areas or small cities," he said. "I think those people have been forgotten."


As chairman of the Senate's Veterans and Military Affairs Committee, Schmitz sponsored a bill to compensate veterans and families who were victims of Agent Orange.
