
DEATH OF GILBERT GRAHAM.—The many friends of this gentleman throughout the State, though not unprepared for the announcement, will yet be grieved to learn that he has finally gone to "that undiscovered country." He died yesterday morning at four o'clock.

Mr. Graham came to this county from Canada in 1858, and took a contract for grading on the Milwaukee, St. Paul and Minneapolis railroad—then known as the Minneapolis and Cedar Valley railroad. Since that time he has been closely identified with the rapidly developing railroad interests of Minnesota.

During his residence here he has served one term in the State Legislature, and filled other important positions, always with credit to himself and benefit to his fellow citizens.

He died after a protracted illness, at the age of 47 years, lamented by all who knew him.
