Messrs. Bergerud, Welch, Bondhus and Mellon offered the following resolution and moved its adoption.

Whereas, Almighty God in His infinite wisdom has called from our midst the Honorable John M. Belden of Minneapolis, who served as a distinguished member of this House during the Thirtieth Legislative Session; and

Whereas, During his term of public service he represented the people of the Twenty-seventh Legislative District, and of the State of Minnesota with distinction; and

Whereas, He was one of the early pioneers in our State, having settled at Montrose in Wright County, Minnesota in 1876; and served his community as one of the first school teachers therein, serving in such capacity for nineteen years; and

Whereas, He later moved to Minneapolis, Hennepin County, Minnesota, where he resided with his wife at the time of his death on April 24, 1941; and where he was active in community and church affairs, being an honored member of Joyce Methodist Church in Minneapolis;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, By the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota that it hereby expresses its sincere regrets at the passing of John M. Belden and hereby conveys its deep sympathy to his bereaved family and directs that an engrossed copy of this resolution as adopted be sent to his family as a mark of our esteem; and

Be It Further Resolved, That the Chief Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to send an engraved copy of this resolution, as engrossed, to the family of the deceased.
