During recess Mrs. Lini Fuhr, of New York, N. Y., a representative of the Medical Bureau Aid for Spanish Democracy gave a description of conditions as she saw them in Spain.

RECONVENED.

The House reconvened at 3:45 o'clock, P. M., and was again called to order by the Speaker.

MOTIONS AND RESOLUTIONS—CONTINUED.

Messrs. Barker and Paulson, J. A., introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

RESOLUTION.

Whereas, Almighty God in His Infinite Wisdom called Albin E. Bjorklund to his eternal reward on Saturday, June 19, 1937, and

Whereas, Albin E. Bjorklund gave distinguished service in the House of Representatives during the Sessions of 1915 and 1917, and

Whereas, In his contact with his fellowman he was ever earnest, congenial and kindly, and in public life whole heartedly devoted to the service of the best interest of the state,

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota that we hereby declare our sense of loss at his death and extend our deepest sympathy to his family and that a copy of this resolution be sent to the family as a mark of our esteem and as a token of affection for the departed former member and friend; and

Be It Further Resolved, That the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives be, and is, hereby instructed to send a copy of this resolution to the family of the deceased and that the Chief Clerk send a suitable floral offering.

Which was unanimously adopted by a rising vote.

GENERAL ORDERS.

The House resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole, with Mr. Slen in the chair.

After some time spent therein, the Committee arose and the Speaker resumed the chair, whereupon Mr. Slen reported that the Committee had considered:

H. F. Nos. 128, 141, 77, 114, 90 and 91, upon which it reported progress, retaining their places on General Orders.

S. F. No. 16, which it recommended advanced to the Calendar subject to amendment.

On motion of Mr. Slen, the report of the Committee of the Whole House was adopted.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS—CONTINUED.

Messrs. Nordin, McNulty, Julkowski and Harrison introduced—
H. F. No. 202, A bill for an act to add a new route to the Trunk Highway System of Minnesota.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules.

Mr. Feidt introduced—

H. F. No. 203, A bill for an act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 211, as amended by Laws 1929, Chapter 201 and Chapter 408, and Laws 1937, Chapter 475, relating to retirement of Justices and Commissioners of the Supreme Court and Judges of the District Court of this State and providing for their compensation.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules.

At 4:04 o'clock, P. M., Mr. Johnson moved that the House do now adjourn.

And the Speaker declared the House adjourned until 2:00 o'clock, P. M., tomorrow.
