*Whereas*, The Honorable John L. Oleson, a member of the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, during the sessions of 1903 and 1905, passed away at North Branch, Minnesota, on the 6th day of December, 1925, leaving a bereaved spouse and son, together with other relatives and a great number of friends, who are grieved at his passing, and

*Whereas*, In his career from the time he immigrated from Sweden in the year 1868, to settle at Red Wing, Minnesota, where he remained for a period of 10 years, after which he removed to Chisago County in the year 1878, where he remained to earn a livelihood as a farmer and merchant at North Branch, Minnesota, and in fulfilling many public and political positions of trust and responsibility, he displayed the sturdy courage, perseverance and energy which the old world, through its immigrants, has contributed to the upbuilding of this great nation, and

*Whereas*, In his contacts with his fellowmen, he was ever earnest, sincere, congenial and kindly, and in public life whole-heartedly devoted to the service of the best interests of the state; therefore,

*Be It Resolved*, By the House of Representatives of Minnesota, that it hereby declares its sense of loss in his untimely death and extends its deepest sympathy to his bereaved family and that this resolution, as adopted, be sent to the family in token of our action, and as a mark of our esteem and affection for our departed friend and brother, and

*Be It Further Resolved*, That the Chief Clerk be and he is hereby authorized to have an engrossed copy of this resolution sent to the family of the deceased.
