Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives, that the proposed reduction of taxing oleomargarine from ten cents to two cents per pound, now before the Senate of the United States, is unfair to the dairy and farming interests of this state; therefore

Be It Resolved, That we earnestly protest against such reduction; that the House of Representatives of Minnesota hereby instruct the Senators from this state at Congress to oppose such reduction; and

Be It Further Resolved, That the Chief Clerk of the House be instructed to send a copy of this resolution, by telegram, to the members of the Senate from this state.
