HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 27.

A RESOLUTION IN MEMORIAM FOR THE HONORABLE
AL BURNAP.

Whereas, In the death of Representative Al Burnap on February 15, 1948, our state lost a loyal son, our Legislature a faithful consistent advocate of good government, and

Whereas, He had long been interested in the affairs of his town and community and took an active and prominent part in public affairs, and served as representative from Fillmore County in the 1939, 1941, 1943, 1945 and 1947 sessions of the Legislature and was always regarded as one of the outstanding members of the House, and

Whereas, In 1917 he entered the Second Officers Reserve Training Camp, was commissioned a first lieutenant in November of that year, was promoted to captain in the 29th Infantry on June 25, 1918, and at the time of his discharge in April, 1919 he was provost marshal of the Panama Canal zone, and

Whereas, It wasn't these activities alone that earned for him his high place he held in our affection and esteem. Above all he was a gentleman in the truest sense, never failing in courtesy, understanding and sympathy; the world is the poorer for his passing and we who learned to love him more as we knew him better believe him worthy of the greeting, "Well done, good and faithful servant".

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved, That this resolution be inscribed upon our records as a memorial of our deep sense of loss in the passing of our fellow worker and friend and our heartfelt sympathy for his family whose loss and sorrow are so much greater than ours.

Mr. Thompson paid a tribute to the memory of the late Mr. Burnap, and moved that the foregoing resolution be adopted.

Which motion prevailed and the resolution was unanimously adopted by a rising vote.

In concluding the Memorial Services, the Speaker paid a fitting tribute to the memory of these former members of the House, and Mr. Dunn added his tribute to their memory and introduced the relatives of the deceased members who were present. The Memorial Service was concluded with a moment of silent tribute by the members of the House.
