HON. WILLIAM V. BURROUGHS

Whereas, the Honorable William V. Burroughs, a member of the House of Representatives from the 14th District for the 1947 and 1949 Sessions, was called by Divine Providence during the past year; and

Whereas, he was born March 31, 1878, at El Paso, Indiana, and came to Sleepy Eye, Minnesota, as a young man, and engaged in farming for more than 30 years; he was a zealous worker in the agriculture industry of this State and gave much from his experience and wisdom to the improvement of conditions in this basic industry of our State; and

Whereas, he was vitally interested in the affairs of his community giving freely of his time and efforts in that behalf, a sincere and helpful friend, and a devoted husband and father;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, that the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota grieved by the loss of our friend and co-worker, hereby extend to his widow and children our deepest sympathy in this our mutual sorrow; and
