FRONTIER NEWS.

Bully Wells and Daughter Killed.

In the latter part of June last, Bully Wells, two sons, daughter and an Indian, from Faribault, went to the forks of Rock river, west of the Des Moines in this State, on a trapping expedition. They were located at the above described point in two camps—the father, daughter and youngest son in one, and the oldest son and the Indian in the other. Last week one day the three last named were absent on an elk hunt. While absent, twelve Indians came into the old man's camp, and he attempted to converse with them, but they would not reply. Suddenly several raised their guns and shot him dead and wounded the daughter. As soon as the son and Indian returned to camp, they collected their traps and started for the settlements. The daughter died upon reaching Fairmont on Thursday. The remainder of the party passed through Winnebago City yesterday, en route for Faribault. The sons say they intend to raise a party of Indians and half-breeds at Faribault and will go back and avenge the murder of their father and sister.
