"Now that the amend-ment has failed," says Kroehler, "I feel very strongly that the reapportionment act

Kroehler will pick up support for this from other rural legislators, just as he may for his consistent objection to daylight saving time.

He was born on the farm three miles west of Henderson where he lived 62 years, until he retired a year ago to turn it over to his son, Arden, 29. During that time he served on the school board 21 years, on the Star Creamery association board for 18 years, was seven years on the Farm Bureau county board and president four years, and headed the Sibley county extension committee four years.

He is past president of the Minnesota Territorial Pioheers, is Republican and a senate Conservative. He and his wife also are parents of three other grown children.
