REP. MICHAEL MCGUIRE
17th District—LeSueur county

Deep interest in education and government brings Rep. Michael E. McGuire back to the Minnesota house of representatives.

McGuire majored in education and political science in getting a degree from St. Thomas college in 1949. He went

on to the University of Minnesota to get his law degree in 1952 and two years later made his first bid for the LeSueur county house seat. *Mpls. Star*

McGuire, 32, graduated from Henderson, Minn., high school and two days after his 19th birthday was part of the landing forces on the Normandy beachhead of World War II, a scout for the Second infantry division.

Eighteen months, three wounds and several medals later he was mustered out to finish his education and to practice law first in St. Louis Park and then at LeSueur. He stayed there until last spring when he joined John Lebens at Montgomery in a law office partnership.

McGuire missed getting on the education committee in 1955, his first term, but has been vice chairman of the education laws and recodification commission since that time. He was vice chairman of the 1955 judiciary committee and a member of the agriculture, highways, taxes, banking and law enforcement committees.

He and dark-haired wife Eleanor have three children, Mickey, four; Colleen, three, and Paddy, nearly one year.
