Montevideo Veterinarian Is Honored

Dr. Vernon K. Jensen, Montevideo, received the "Veterinarian of the Year" award, highest honor bestowed by Minnesota Veterinary Medical Association at the annual convention dinner Tuesday in the St. Paul Hilton Hotel.

A graduate of Ontario Veterinary Medical College, Guelph, Ont., Jensen has practiced in his native Montevideo for 29 years.

He has served the association as a member of its board of trustees and as president in 1967.

Prior to launching his own practice, he served five years in the Bureau of Animal Industry of the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

In 1965 he was elected to the Minnesota Senate in a special election and won reelection in 1966. He is a former member of the Montevideo School Board and has received the 4H award for outstanding service.

Also honored at the banquet were Rep. Ancher Nelson, R-Minn., Dr. J. A. Myers, professor emeritus of public health medicine at the University of Minnesota, and William H. Krober, former editor of The Farmer magazine, St. Paul, who were named honorary association members.

Earlier Dr. W. C. Cullen, Mankato, was elected association president, succeeding Dr. J. O. Hanson, New Brighton.

Dr. J. P. Arnold, White Bear Lake, was named president-elect; Dr. E. R. Hokkanen, Minneapolis, first vice-president; and Dr. Stanley Held, Buffalo, second vice-president.

Dr. B. S. Pomeroy, St. Paul was reelected secretary treasurer.
