INTRODUCTION OF BILLS.

Mr. Ettel introduced—

H. F. No. 66, A bill for an act to amend Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 2553, Subsection 5, relating to the Commissioner of Highways.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Buildings.

Messrs. Champlin and Severson introduced—

H. F. No. 67, A bill for an act relating to the housing of the State Highway Department.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Public Highways.

Messrs. Eriksson, L., Ost, Wahlstrand, Lieske, Finstuen, Hove and Iverson introduced—

H. F. No. 68, A bill for an act proposing an amendment to Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota to provide for civil service in such state and to authorize and direct the Legislature of such state to enact the legislation necessary therefor, said amendment to be known as Paragraph 10 of Article 5.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Civil Administration.

Messrs. Wanvick and Thompson introduced—

H. F. No. 69, A bill for an act providing for rear exits on motor vehicles transporting passengers for hire.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Motor Vehicles and Motor Tax Laws.

Messrs. Terwilliger and Finstuen introduced—

H. F. No. 70, A bill for an act to reimburse Lenus R. Olson for damages to his automobile while pursuing and apprehending escaped inmates of the Minnesota State Training School at Red Wing.

Which was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Claims.

Mr. Jesten introduced—

H. F. No. 71, A bill for an act to appropriate the sum of Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000.00), to the County of Clay, a municipal corporation of the State of Minnesota, for the use of said county in connection with the criminal trial, or trials, of the officers, directors and members of the executive committee of the Northwest Bancorporation, in the County of Clay and State of Minnesota.
