Sen. Robert R. Dunlap, 39 year old Plainview attorney, says he is the black sheep in a family of newspaper men. His late father, Roy J. Dunlap, was editor of the St. Paul Dispatch and Pioneer Press for 35 years. His brother, Roy J., a columnist, has been with the St. Paul papers since 1939.

Attorney Dunlap who will serve his second term in the senate, was re-elected by voters of the Third district without opposition.

He was elected Wabasha county attorney in 1950 and left that office after half a term to run for the senate. He is a Republican and caucuses with the conservatives.

While getting his law degree at the University of Minnesota, Dunlap worked as a clerk in the administration office of the State Agricultural society at the Minnesota State Fair.

He is a Mason, a Legionnaire and member of Phi Delta Phi legal fraternity and the Minnesota State Bar association.

Dunlap served in Europe as an infantry captain during World War II with the Ninth, Seventh and First armies from 1942-46. He still retains his status with the army reserve. He married Jane E. Smith of Franklin, Va., June 15, 1946 after his discharge.

He and Mrs. Dunlap have four children, Jane, Elizabeth, Robert and John Craig, born this year.
