When the legislature goes into "covered clock" session to make believe time is standing still while it finishes work, it does so without Sen. Daniel S. Feidt of Minneapolis.

The constitution calls for the legislature to do its work in 90 days. Feidt refuses to go along with the fiction that covering the clock makes additional days legal.

Feidt has been a 34th district legislator since 1937, when he served a term in the house of representatives. Two years later he went to the senate.

His senate committee assignments include such heavy-weights as banks and banking, for which he is chairman; judiciary; rules and a half-dozen others. Feidt currently is chairman of the legislative interim commission on juvenile delinquency.

During his legislative career Feidt has co-authored the bills that created the state civil service system, the youth conservation commission, the legislative research commission and the presidential primary.

He and his wife, Jean, live at 1715 W. Franklin avenue and are the parents of three children--Dan, seven; Joseph four, and Mary Virginia, three.
