Rep. Frank Furst bounced back from a narrow defeat of 1954 to win the Wabasha

county house seat last fall that he had held in the 1953 session, his first term.

Furst is a Wabasha county old-timer, born in Lake City 65 years ago. After at-

tending public schools at Lake City he got a job in a weekly newspaper office doing the backroom "printer's devil" chores and learning the printing trade.

He abandoned it when he got married, however. Instead, he bought a farm southwest of town. He's farmed it for the past 40 years, now helped by a son, William. Another son, Walter, farms nearby.

Furst has been a township assessor, member of his district school board, and a director and secretary of the Oak Center Co-op creamery. He has specialized in raising purebred Jersey cattle and for a time was a director and vice president of the state's Jersey Cattle club.

He also served as vice chairman and director of the Wabasha county Farm Bureau, is still a shareholder in the Lake City Co-op Farmers Elevator. He is a member of the St. John's Lutheran church at Lake City.

Furst will caucus with conservatives, as he did in 1953.
