H. F. No. 369, A bill for an act to appropriate \$330.00 for the payment of a soldiers' bonus to Stanley Christoskey.

H. F. No. 370, A bill for an act providing for the acquisition of land by the State Agricultural Society and the construction of buildings at the State Fair Grounds in accordance with a comprehensive building plan; and providing for the levying of taxes therefor and for the issuance of certificates of indebtedness to provide funds in anticipation of the collection of such taxes; for the creation of a State Agricultural Society Building Fund and the appropriation of money therefrom and for the purposes of this act.

Be It Further Resolved, that the Chief Clerk be and is hereby authorized to have an engrossed copy of this resolution sent to the family of the deceased.
