

J. B. GOODSPEED IS DEAD AT 78

John Byron Goodspeed, 78, a pioneer settler at Richfield and a former member of the state legislature, died Wednesday night at his home at Richfield. Born April 26, 1856, at Vassalboro, Me., he came to Richfield in 1867 and had lived there until his death.

Active in politics at the turn of

the century, Mr. Goodspeed was state representative from the old forty second district in 1899 and 1909. He was at that time also a member of the board of supervisors of Richfield, a member of the Hennepin county committee and the state bridge commission in 1909.

He had engaged in farming all his life until his retirement a few years ago. Surviving are the widow, Margaret M. Goodspeed, and a son, John Graham Goodspeed.
