MEMORIAL SERVICES FOR THE LATE

WILLIAM E. HONEYCUTT.

Messrs. Bergerud, Gleason, Haeg, McNulty, Connors, Murk, Weg-

ner, Hagland, Lyse, Lundeen, Volstad, French, Root, Brophey, Welch, Fitzsimmons, and Matchan offered the following resolution:

Whereas, Honorable William E. Honeycutt, a member of the House of Representatives during the sessions of 1943 and 1945 from the 30th District of Hennepin County, was called by Divine Providence to his eternal reward on February 26, 1945,

Whereas, his life was an example and an inspiring guide to his fellowmen, and

Whereas, in his association with his fellowmen, he was earnest, helpful, friendly and kind, and in his public life devout and sincere to the service of the best interests of the State. Now, Therefore,

Be It Resolved, that the House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, grievously sensing his untimely passing, herewith extends to his bereaved family its deepest sympathy, with the earnest hope that with the passing of time their acute sorrow from the loss of a husband and father will abate and that some refuge will be found in the memories of pleasant times spent with him.

Further Resolved, that an engrossed copy of this Resolution be sent to his family as a mark of esteem and as a token of affection for a departed comrade and friend.

Mr. Bergerud moved that the foregoing resolution be adopted.

Messrs. Bergerud, Gleason, Haeg, Lundeen, French, Fitzsimmons, Brophey and Lyse paid tribute to the memory of the late William E. Honeycutt.
