G. Humphrey, former state representative, is dead at 64

George F. Humphrey, former staterepresentative from Minneapolis, died Sunday at the Veterans Administration Hospital following a long illness. He was 64.

Humphrey was a retired life insurance broker and a Conservative (now Independent-Republican) member of the Minnesota House from 1965 to 1973. His district included the Kenwood and Lake of the Isles area, and he lived at 1936 Irving Av. S.

He was born in Greenwood, Miss Hereceived a bachelor's degree in economics from Southwestern University, Memphis, Tenn., in 1938 and a master's degree in education from the University of Minnesota in 1946. He served in the U.S. Army Air Corps and the Air Force for 7 years, including duty during World War II and the Korean War.

Humphrey was a broker for Northwest Mutual Life Insurance Co. from 1946 to 1961. He was a member of the Minneapolis School Board from 1963 to 1964, and also served on the Minneapolis Citizens Committee on Public Education, Friends of the Library Board and on the board of Women in Service to Education and Gentlemen in Service to Education.

Survivors include his wife, Virginia; two sons, George Jr., of Campden, Ontario, and John, St. Louis Park; two daughters, Susan of Anchorage, Alaska, and Virginia of Raleigh, N.C., a brother, William R. Jr., Wayzata, and five grandchildren.
