#### HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 7

Providing for payment of legal fees and costs incurred by Michael Mulder in an Election Contest.

*Whereas*, Michael Mulder has incurred legal fees and costs of \$2,464.23 due to an Election Contest in the District Court for the County of Ramsey, State of Minnesota, between himself and Dominic J. Parozino, both men having been candidates for the office of Representative from the 40th District, 4th Ward and,

*Whereas*, Michael Mulder was the winning candidate in the general election, November 8, 1960, was certified as such, was the prevailing party in said Election Contest,

*Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the House of Representatives* that Michael Mulder be paid \$2,464.23 from the Legislative Expense Fund as reimbursement for such expenses.

The resolution was referred to the Committee on Rules.

#### HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3

Stating the policy of the state of Minnesota with regard to business development in the state.

*Whereas*, a healthy industrial climate is necessary if the state of Minnesota is to have sound economic development;

*Whereas*, the state of Minnesota has the necessary qualities to provide a healthy industrial climate, as evidenced by its community progressiveness, honest, efficient government, sound employee relations, and an adequate supply of people;

*Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved* by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring, that the Legislature and Executive Officers of the State of Minnesota, representing all the people of Minnesota, reaffirm the deep interest which this State has in promoting and encouraging industrial development and job opportunities, and pledges itself to examine all proposed legislation relating to business and industry in terms of its effect upon the maintenance of a healthy business climate in Minnesota, which will encourage the necessary investment of capital and the creation of needed payrolls to support our expanding population.

This we will do by:

Equitable treatment in legislative and administrative regulation of all segments of the Minnesota economy;

A framework of government imposing no greater costs to do business than in other states;

Equitable tax policies and restriction of cost of government to reasonable levels;

Fair treatment in legislation and administration of labor-management relations for industry and labor;

And by fostering an atmosphere enabling industry to compete for out-of-state markets.

The resolution was referred to the Committee on Rules.

#### FIRST READING OF SENATE FILES

S. F. No. 161, A bill for an act relating to the limitation on the consumption or display of intoxicating liquors; amending Minnesota Statutes 1957, Section 340.14, Subdivision 3.

The bill was read for the first time and referred to the Committee on Temperance and Liquor Control.

#### CONSENT CALENDAR

H. F. No. 717, A bill for an act to legalize proceedings heretofore adopted by the council of the village of Slayton in connection with a sewer improvement and authorizing the issuance of bonds to finance said improvement.

Reported the same back with the following amendments:

Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert in lieu thereof the following new language:

"Section 1. Extra Session Laws 1959, Chapter 71, Article I, Section 17, is amended by adding a new subdivision to read:

"Subd. 5. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed as preventing parents of a handicapped educable child from sending such child to a school of their choice, if they so elect, subject to admission standards and policies to be adopted pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes 1957, Chapter 248, and all other provisions of Chapter 71, Extra Session Laws 1959."

Further amend the title by striking the word "visually."

With the recommendation that when so amended the bill do pass, and be placed on the Consent Calendar.

The report was adopted.

Mr. Rutter from the Committee on Municipal Affairs to which was referred:

H. F. No. 1931, A bill for an act relating to the city of White Bear Lake, the villages of Arden Hills, Falcon Heights, Gem Lake, Little Canada, Lauderdale, Maplewood, Mounds View, New Brighton, North Oaks, North St. Paul, Roseville, St. Anthony, Shoreview, and Vadnais Heights, and the town of White Bear; granting certain powers and authority thereto.

Reported the same back with the recommendation that the bill do pass, and be placed on the Consent Calendar.
