Karl Neumeier, ex-state

Karl Neumeier, 103, a former state Senator and University of Minnesota vegent, died Friday at Greeley Health Care Center in Stillwater.

Neumeier, of Stillwater, ran for the Senate seat of his law partner, George L. Sullivan, who died in the 1930s. Neumeier served from 1934 to 1950.

The was a crusader for lower taxes, withoring a bill to allow state income faxes to be filed jointly, something operviously allowed only on federal taxes. He was chairman of the Senate "Tax Committee and set up the "Litthe Hoover Commission," which monitored legislative efficiency.

In 1953 he was voted to the university Board of Regents, but was strongly challenged for the appointment by Hudence Cutright in one of the first options to get a woman elected to the bost. He retired from the board in 1959 to return to his private law practice, and he continued to work applied to work a statement of the state
