REP. HARVEY N. PAULSON

14th District—Brown-Redwood
Counties

A solid, conservative "dirt farmer" with a long record of community activity and a passion for soil conservation is the new representative of the state's 14th district in the Minnesota House of Representatives — Harvey N. Paulson. *Mpls. Star*

A native of Brown county, he was graduated from Sleepy Eye, Minn., high school and turned to farming as his parents had before him. He is 53.



He owes allegiance to both Brown and Redwood counties because for the past 16 years the farm he operated lies just across the line in Redwood county.

Paulson has served as a 4-H club and youth leader in the area for the past 18 years.

He has been township chairman and board member for the past 13.

Active in soil conservation work for many years, he is now supervisor of the Redwood county Soil Conservation district.

He will line up with the conservatives in the legislature.

Paulson, with the active assistance of W. E. Barnes, editor of the Sleepy Eye Herald-Dispatch, was elected to office by a majority of 2,700 in a contest in which 19,000 votes were cast.

A married man, he and his wife have two daughters, Kay, 18, who lives at home, and Mrs. Omar H. Hallevig, wife of a minister in Marshall, Minn.
