Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the House of Representatives of Minnesota that it hereby expresses its regrets at his untimely death and extends its deep sympathy to his bereaved family and that the resolution as adopted be sent to the family in token of our action and as a mark of our affection and esteem for the departed comrade and friend, and

Be It Further Resolved, that the Chief Clerk be and is hereby authorized to have an engrossed copy of this resolution sent to the family of the deceased.
