Termination of Long Illness of Dr. A. Plummer Comes Late Wed- nesday Afternoon

Dr. A. Plummer departed this life Wednesday afternoon at 4:00 o'clock after an illness covering a period of several months.

Albert Plummer was born in Auburn, New Hampshire, Sept. 7, 1810, the son of Nathan Plummer. He received his early education in the New Hampshire schools, graduating from Kimball University at Meriden, N. H. He began the study of medicine shortly after and received his degree from Bowdoin College. In 1862 he enlisted in the Union Army and was soon promoted to the rank of assistant surgeon in the Tenth New Hampshire Regiment, discharging his duties with credit until the close of the strife in 1865. Two years later he came west, locating at Hamilton, Minn., where he began the practice of medicine.

October 10, 1872, Dr. Plummer was united in marriage to Miss Isabelle Steere. Two sons, Dr. Henry S. and Dr. William Plummer, both of this city, survive to comfort their mother.

Dr. and Mrs. Plummer and family continued to reside in Hamilton until 1893 when the doctor removed to Racine. He continued to reside there until last June when he removed to Rochester. He held membership in the Fillmore county and the Southern Minnesota medical societies.

The remains will be taken to Racine Friday, after a short service at the home, 111 West Fifth street. Rev. Mr. Bedford of Dover, a close friend, will officiate. Services will be held in Racine at two o'clock, interment being made there.

The passing of Dr. A. Plummer ends a life of usefulness, an inspiration to his fellowmen. Dr. Plummer was interested in municipal and governmental affairs. In 1892 he was elected by Fillmore county as its representative to St. Paul and served two years. He was a member of the Masonic order, I. O. O. F., and the G. A. R. To the sorrowing relatives, the sincere sympathy of hosts of friends is extended. One brother, Edwin Plummer of Auburn, N. H., and one sister, Mrs. Henry Bond, of Santa Barbara, Ca., also survive.
