Popp, 65, was elected to the Senate in 1958 as an independent, but he caucused as a Conservative. He was chairman of the Welfare - Corrections, subcommittee of the Finance Committee.

He also was chairman of the Senate Elections Committee. Between the 1967 and 1969 sessions he led a special Senate committee studying the need for a second medical school in Minnesota.

Popp served as mayor of Hutchinson from 1953-58 before coming to the Senate. From 1949 to 1953 he was a member of the Hutchinson school board.

A graduate of the University of Wisconsin School of Pharmacy, the owned the Popp Rexall Drug Store in Hutchinson.

The Popps had one daughter, Susan, who survives.
