> Holmquist said he would ask the Senate Committee on Committees to meet Wednesday to fill committee vacancies created by Sen. Popp's death. Sen. Popp was chairman of the Elections and Reapportionment Committee and a member of the Com-merce, Finance, Labor, Local Government, Public Welfare and Rules Committees.

House Speaker Lloyd Duxbury said the House would meet today but would adjourn tomorrow in honor of the late senator. Committee meetings will go on as scheduled unless canceled by the chairmen, he said.
