1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 626.19, subdivision 3, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 3. Authorized use. A law enforcement agency may use a UAV:
1.8	(1) during or in the aftermath of an emergency situation that involves the risk of death
1.9	or bodily harm to a person;
1.10	(2) to provide more expansive aerial coverage for the purpose of searching for a missing
1.11	person including but not limited to a missing child or vulnerable adult;
1.12	(2) (3) over a public event where there is a heightened risk to the safety of participants
1.13	or bystanders;
1.14	(3) (4) to counter the risk of a terrorist attack by a specific individual or organization if
1.15	the agency determines that credible intelligence indicates a risk;
