
The Transportation Advancement Account (TAA) was created in 2023 to administer funding to local agencies for transportation purposes. The fund assists CGMC member cities by providing ongoing revenues to the Small Cities Assistance Account and the Larger Cities Assistance Account.

OVERVIEW OF PHASE-IN SCHEDULE

The TAA is funded through the new \$.50 delivery fee on retail sales over \$100 and increasing dedication of general sales tax on auto parts until fully phased in by 2033.
