Budget Periods and Fiscal Years

• State Fiscal Year: July 1st to June 30th

• Federal Fiscal Year: October 1st to September 30th

• Current Biennium: FY2025 ends June 30th

Upcoming Biennium: FY2026 begins July 1st

Budget Terms

Direct Appropriation

- An appropriation for a specific amount of money, for use only during a specific time period, usually the biennium.
- Most appropriations in omnibus bills are direct appropriations.

Statutory Appropriation

- An appropriation made in statute (instead of session law) authorizing the ongoing payment out of the treasury for a program.
- In contrast to direct appropriations, statutory appropriations need not be renewed every biennium for funding to continue.

Budget Terms

Open Appropriation

- A form of statutory appropriation where the level of funding necessary to fulfill the obligation is made available in the fiscal year.
- The state fund balance shows an estimate of the amount expected to be spent.
- Most commonly funds programs funded by formula or programs funded through fees.

Budget Terms

Base

• The amount appropriated for the program in the second year of the previous biennium. (For example, the base for FY 2026 is the amount appropriated for FY 2025.) A different base may be specified in law.

Tails

• (1) The future budget effects of any appropriation or revenue provision; or (2) an appropriation, funding formula, or tax expenditure that takes effect in, or carries forward to a future biennium, a higher future costs/ revenue losses to the state treasury than in the initial biennial budget period.

Subd. 31. Grants for Students with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

200,000

Base Appropriation with Tails Modifier

<u>Subd. 2. State Grants</u> 234,744,000 224,167,000

(a) If the appropriation in this subdivision for either year is insufficient, the appropriation for the other year is available for it.

(b) The base for this appropriation is \$225,066,000 for fiscal year 2026 and later.

Budget Terms: Examples

One Time Appropriation

Subd. 42. Next Generation Nursing Initiative

3,000,000

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For transfer to the Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities for HealthForce

Minnesota to coordinate and implement the Next Generation Nursing Assistant Training Program for the recruitment and training of students to become certified nursing assistants. The program must use a "free up-front" model for covering the student costs. This appropriation may also be used for marketing and outreach across the state and covering the cost for retraining, retesting, and refresher courses. This appropriation is available until June 30, 2025.

Subd. 48. Foster Care Grant

500,000

500,000

\$500,000 the first year and \$500,000 the second year are for a grant to the Foster Advocates Nonprofit
Organization for an education support and wraparound service program that provides assistance and support to individuals who were in foster care at the age of 13 or later, and for individuals who are transitioning from foster care to adulthood, up to age 27, to improve the likelihood of completing a degree and securing a stable career. The program shall provide one-on-one mentoring, leadership development, and additional resources to support each student's education journey through high school graduation and institutions of higher education. This is a onetime appropriation.

u(dget Enactment Timeline — Odd Year Session: Barly December (12-4-2024) – MMB releases November economic forecast.
	☐ January – Legislative session convenes (1-14-2025) . Governor makes budget recommendations (fourth Tuesday in Jan. in 2025). Legislative bill deadlines established.
	☐ End of February – MMB releases February economic forecast.
	☐ March – House Ways and Means Committee and Senate Leadership establish committee spending targets.
	☐ April – Omnibus finance bills leave the House floor. Conference committees begin meeting.
	\square May – Conference committees conclude. Conference committee reports return to the House floor for final passage. Legislature adjourns (no later than 1 st Monday after 3 rd Saturday in May).
	☐ May – Governor signs/vetoes legislation.




On January 24, 2025, the Minnesota Supreme Court held that 68 members are necessary to constitute a quorum of the House.



Minn Statute 135A.01

135A.01 FUNDING POLICY.

It is the policy of the legislature to provide stable funding for public postsecondary institutions and that the state and students share the cost of public postsecondary education. The legislature intends to provide at least 67 percent of the combined revenue from tuition, the university fee at the University of Minnesota, and state general fund appropriations to public postsecondary institutions. It is also the policy of the legislature that the budgetary process serves to support high quality public postsecondary education.



Higher Education General Fund Appropriations 06-27 (\$ in thousands)



- Agricultural State Special
 - Base Appropriation: \$85.844 million
 - Alternative energy and biofuel research (biomass, crops, native plants, etc.).
 - College of Food, Agricultural and Natural Resource Sciences for work in a variety of horticultural, livestock and food systems research.
 - Additional emphasized research priorities as described by law.
 - Must report back to the legislature (ag and higher ed committee) by Feb 1st 2025.
- Health Sciences State Special
 - Base Appropriation: \$18.408 million
 - Includes \$346k a year to support up to 12 resident physicians in the St. Cloud Hospital family practice residency program.
 - Remainder of program dollars for specified health science and veterinary initiatives as described by law.

State Special Appropriations. University of Minnesota

- College of Science and Engineering State Special
 - Base Appropriation: \$2.2 million
 - Geological survey and talented youth mathematics program.
- System Special
 - Base Appropriation: \$14.362 million
 - \$2 million per year for the Natural Resource Research Institute (NRRI) to invest in applied research.
 - Remainder of funding for general research at NRRI, Center for Urban and Regional Affairs,
 Bell Museum of Natural History and the Humphrey Exhibit.

- University of Minnesota and Mayo Foundation Partnership
 - Base Appropriation: \$15.982 million
 - \$7.4 million per year designated for direct and indirect expenses of the research partnership between the University and the Mayo Foundation for research in biotechnology and medical genomics.
 - \$500k per year designated for conducting Alzheimer's related research.
