## FIRST DAY

SAINT PAUL, MINNESOTA, THURSDAY, JUNE 25, 1987

In obedience to the Proclamation of the Honorable Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, summoning the two Houses of the Legislature to meet in Special Session, the members of the House of Representatives assembled in the Chamber of the House of Representatives at the Capitol in Saint Paul on Thursday, the twenty-fifth day of June 1987, at 2:00 p.m.

#### PROCLAMATION FOR SPECIAL SESSION 1987

Whereas, Events have occurred which require an urgent reexamination of Minnesota laws regarding corporate acquisitions; and

Whereas, The people of Minnesota are best served by public policies which foster corporate responsibility to investors, employees and community; and

Whereas, A review of state laws regarding corporate acquisitions can be accomplished in a brief special session of the Minnesota Legislature; and

Whereas, Article IV, Section 12 of the Constitution of the State of Minnesota provides that a special session of the Legislature may be called on extraordinary occasions; and

Whereas, Elected leaders of the Legislature have agreed on an agenda and procedures to complete a special session in the shortest time possible;

Now, Therefore, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby summon you, members of the Legislature, to convene in Special Session on Thursday, June 25, 1987, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon in the Capitol in Saint Paul, Minnesota.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-fourth day of June in the year of our Lord one

thousand nine hundred and eighty-seven, and of the State the one hundred twenty-ninth.

Be It Resolved by the House of Representatives of Minnesota that it congratulates Katherine Killen on being chosen Miss Minnesota 1987.

Be It Further Resolved that the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives is directed to prepare an enrolled copy of this resolution, to be authenticated by his signature and that of the Speaker, and that it be presented to Katherine Killen. Hartle moved that House Resolution No. 1 be now adopted. The motion prevailed and House Resolution No. 1 was adopted.
