Dear Senator Davies:

After careful consideration, and following consultation with a number of concerned groups and individuals, I feel it is necessary, both in my capacity as Governor of the State of Minnesota and as Chairman of the State Board of Investment, to veto Senate File 1637. I have not signed this bill nor filed it with the Secretary of State.

I deplore discrimination anywhere on the basis of race, religion, color, creed or sex as much as any member of the Legislature. The system of apartheid, which is institutionalized in South Africa is a morally repugnant and unacceptable practice. However, it is my belief that S.F. 1637 would have no impact on the policies of the government of South Africa, but, rather, would simply have an impact on the ability of the State of Minnesota to maximize its investment returns for the retirement and State funds managed by the State Board of Investment.

My decision to veto this bill is based on two factors:

1. A number of individuals from the investment community have expressed

concern about any legislation which would reduce the Board's investment flexibility. In addition, the applicability standard established in Section 2 of the bill is unclear and may broaden the scope and impact of the legislation to make it more far-reaching than intended by the Legislature. The State would likely be involved in expensive and lengthy litigation.

2. The State Board of Investment has demonstrated its commitment to promoting corporate social responsibility by actively voting its proxies to effect social and economic change. By prohibiting future investments in certain financial institutions, S.F. 1637 would deprive the Board of its ability to influence through positive actions the loan policies of these institutions. I believe that the State of Minnesota can have a greater impact on these companies by owning their stock and by voting the State's proxies. There is little evidence that prohibiting the State's investment in these institutions will result in any outcome other than having those securities purchased by other investors.

For the foregoing reasons, I believe this bill must be vetoed.

Dear Mr. President:

By not signing and not filing with the Secretary of State, I am vetoing Senate File 1988, a bill that relates to the Small Business Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program.

The Community Development Block Grant program was authorized by Congress in 1974 and is one of a number of federal programs being transferred to the states. The Department of Energy, Planning and Development is charged with the administration of the Small Cities Community Development Block Grant program.

Because states are allowed considerable flexibility in administration of the Community Development Block Grant program, the Department of Energy, Planning and Development has devoted much time and effort during the past eight months to develop a program design which addresses the community development needs of Minnesota's communities while remaining within the intent of federal legislation. The Department of Energy, Planning and Development has been very conscientious in its efforts to solicit and utilize recommendations from concerned organizations, elected oficials and other interested parties throughout the program design process.

The Community Development Block Grant program was designed to give local governments greater flexibility in determining how CDBG funds could best be utilized to meet their local community development needs. Communities could undertake a wide variety of eligible activities set out in the 1974 act: 1) principally benefitting persons of low and moderate income; 2) aiding in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight; 3) meeting other community development needs having a particular urgency.

Senate File 1988 contains no reference to the three objectives of the Community Development Block Grant program and instead emphasizes the requirement of direct benefit to low and moderate income persons.

Therefore, I am vetoing Senate File 1988 for two main reasons: 1) it imposes

additional strings on small cities which are not imposed on large cities, and 2) it limits flexibility in identifying projects at a time when emphasis in state programs is on insuring such flexibility.

By not signing and not filing with the Secretary of State, I am vetoing Senate File 1207, a bill that relates to liquor store licensing.

S.F. 1207 purports to exempt certain off-sale liquor licensees and others having an interest in those licenses from the single license limitation of Minnesota Statutes, Section 340.13, Subdivision 3 (1980). The exception created by S.F. 1207 appears to violate Article XII, Section 1, Minnesota Constitution and Amendment XIV, United States Constitution, to the extent that it amounts to special legislation in denial of equal protection of the law to all persons similarly situated.

Although this legislation might very well resolve one pending lawsuit against the State of Minnesota, further litigation may be invited were it to become law.
