SUSPENSION OF RULES

The bill was passed and its title agreed to.

GENERAL ORDERS

Pursuant to Rules of the House, the House resolved itself into the Committee of the Whole, with Mr. Dirlam in the Chair, for the consideration of bills pending on General Orders of the Day.

The Speaker resumed the Chair, whereupon the following proceedings of the Committee were reported to the House :

H. F. Nos. 557 and 1218 which it recommended to pass.

H. F. No. 167 which it recommended to pass with the following amendment :

The printed bill, as follows :

Page 1, strike all of line 9 after the words "*character, the*" and all of line 10 through the words "*project area*" and insert in lieu thereof the following: "*residents of the project area have participated in the formulation of the redevelopment plan for the project area through a committee elected by the residents of the affected area in an annual election conducted by the local governing body*".

H. F. No. 851 which it recommended to pass as amended in the Committee of the Whole on Monday, March 22, 1971, and with the following amendments :

The printed bill, as follows :

Page 1, lines 9 and 10, strike "; (d) A person whose blood contains 0.10 percent or more by weight of alcohol".

Page 2, lines 15 through 18, delete the new language.

Page 2, lines 14 through 36, reinstate the stricken language.

Page 3, reinstate the stricken language on lines 1 to 3.

The printed bill, as follows :

Page 3, line 18, after the word "*death,*" and before the word "*or*" insert the following: "*and the officer has reasonable and probable grounds to believe that the person was driving or operating the motor vehicle while said person was under the influence of an alcoholic beverage,*".

H. F. No. 1484 upon which it recommended progress.

On the motion of Mr. Lindstrom, the report of the Committee of the Whole was adopted.
